ATTENDANCE

University Requirement

1. 75% and above for all courses both in UG/PG to appear for examination (theory/practical)

Condonation of Shortage of Attendance

2. 65% - 75% - Rs.250/- (Theory & Practical separate)

3. 65% - 50% - Not eligible for Condonation. Not permitted to write the end semester exam but permitted to proceed to the next semester.

4. Less than 50% - Repeat the course (by re joining) not permitted to write End Semester Examination.

5. Married women - 55% attendance needed with Condonation Rs.250/-

DRESS CODE

Boys:

The students should wear formal shirts and pants, well-groomed hair and clean-shaven face are important in their preservable appearance. Jeans and T-shirts, slippers are not allowed inside the campus. Boys should avoid growing long hair, beard and coloring the hair. Wearing bangles bracelets, ring or studs in the ears are strictly prohibited.

Girls:

All girls should wear churidar with lengthy tops and duputta that touch below the knee level. Short tops, sleeveless, tops with net sleeves, transparent dress, leggings/stretch pants are not allowed.

For all college events, Internship, Field work and Placement formal dress code should be followed

ID Card

Wearing ID card is compulsory inside the campus on all days and should wear the same they enter the campus. Strict action will be taken against the students the moment who fail to wear ID cards.

VALUE EDUCATION

SCRIPTURE

An organized study of the bible offered to all Christian students. They undergo a course on destination excellence. These courses inspire the students to understand the Bible in its perspectives for nurturing & nourishing their spiritual yet practical Christian living.

HOLISTIC VALUE EDUCATION

The students are motivated to discover their potential develop an integrated personality to practice healthy lifestyles and to be aware of family and social realities, which will help them to become catalysts of change in their families and in the neighbourhood.

a) PHYSICAL EDUCATION

A student has to participate compulsorily in games and sports during the first year as a part of her course requirement. 40 hours of attendance is compulsory. Students will not be eligible for their degree if the credit for games is not earned.

Provision will be made to meet attendance and other academic requirements when the student represents the College, the University, the State or the Country. An official letter duly signed by the organizing agency, Physical Director and Head of the Major Department along with a letter from the parents has to be submitted in the Principal's Office.

OUTREACH / EXTENSION

Nazareth College Outreach Programme will be carried out in adopted village of Vadamadurai. It gives the students the opportunity to get involved in community services on required basis with project allotted to each department. It is anchored by the outreach department. Outreach is compulsory for all the students and transport services will be available based on a common timetable.

COLLEGE OFFICES

OFFICE OF THE PRINCIPAL

Students may meet the Principal during the short break or after class hours. The principal's office should be contacted to obtain leave, Travel Concession forms, Transfer and degree Certificates. The office of the principal is also open for counselling and grievance redressal.

EXAMINATION OFFICE

The Controller of Examinations holds administrative authority over all matters related to examinations. Students are required to read carefully and observe all the rules and regulations relating to examinations.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE

The administrative office holds the responsibility of issuing no due forms, ID cards, collecting fees and other discharging duties assigned by Secretary, Principal and Vice Principal.

FACILITIES

CHAPEL

Nazareth Chapel is a quiet place of worship for staff, students and visitors. There is a chaplain to help the students with their spiritual needs. The choir team sings praises in the chapel. Students are encouraged to use the chapel to pray 24/7.

INDOOR AUDITORIUM

The Centralized Air Conditioned Auditorium has the seating capacity of 500 students and sound infrastructure. It has been built to conduct all State, National and International Conferences and forums.

SEMINAR HALL

The seminar hall has the seating capacity of 120 students and is used to hold minor events.

XEROX SHOP

Students can make use of this facility which is available in the campus.

PLAY GROUND

The college playground is 100 * 50 meters in area and used to trains students for National and International level tournaments and matches. Built over a area of 100*50 meters which is a football court.

BASKETBALL COURT

A Basketball court located in 20 * 15 meters is used to hold inter School and inter College competitions.

TENNIS COURT

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

Students are subject to rules and code of conduct framed by the authorities of the College. It shall be the duty of every student to conduct himself / herself with decorum in all places and circumstances.

- 1 .It is mandatory to wear ID inside the campus and class failing which a fine will be levied.
 - a First time - Rs. 100
 - b Second time - Rs. 500
 - c Third time - Sent home
2. Every student must earn a minimum of 80% attendance to appear for the University Examination.
3. In case of absenteeism because of sickness or accident or any other reason, a leave letter should be submitted with parent's signature.
4. Nazareth is a mobile free campus for students. Using mobile is prohibited.
5. Using cigarettes and narcotic substances and alcohol is strictly prohibited. Any student found consuming alcohol/ smoking/ using tobacco in the campus will be expelled from the college.
6. Every student should maintain decorum both within and outside the campus of the college.
7. Every student should show respect and be courteous to all Management staff, Administration, Visitor and support staff and also their fellow students.
8. Student safety is our primary concern. Student entering the college either by two / four wheeler must possess the driving license.
9. Students are not permitted to invite strangers inside the campus/ class room in case of violation, strict disciplinary action will be taken.
10. Ragging is strictly prohibited and is punishable.
11. The college has the right to take action against students who misbehave with fellow students.
12. Students are warned not to involve in any criminal offence and if found guilty, TC will be issued.

13. Students should take prior permission from the Vice Principal's office to stay back in the college.
14. Damaging property belonging to the college / fellow student/ other employees of the College will be regarded as violation of the code of conduct and disciplinary action will be taken.
15. Students violating the rules and regulations of the College will be expelled from the college.
16. No subscription / donation of any kind shall be collected by students without a written request to the Principal.
17. Any misbehaviour or unlawful activities inside campus will be deemed as violation of the code of conduct.
18. Student must be present in all the Department and College functions.
19. Students are restricted from giving any news and interviews to any newspaper, magazine, Radios and TV channels without obtaining proper consent from the Principal.
20. Students are not permitted to receive letters, Parcels and visitors in college or use the college address for their personal communication.
21. A fine of Rs.500/- will be collected from students who fail to report on the first day after the Semester Exams, Christmas and Pongal holidays and Rs.100/- for every subsequent days of absence. Request from parents for extension of holidays due to personal reasons will not be entertained.
22. Students misusing the facilities in campus, destroying college property and indulging in writing graffiti on the walls and furniture will be duly fined.
23. Important information to students will be put up on notice Boards/College Website. It is the responsibility of every student to check the Notice Boards regularly

General Rules & Regulations

1. The Library has been equipped with more than 6000 quality books on general fields and subjects.
2. Students should handle the books and papers very carefully.
3. Do not mark anything on the books / papers / periodicals.
4. Failure to return books in time will entail a fine of Rs.10/- per book per day.
5. Books on demand will be issued in the order of the date of requisition letters.
6. Reference books and periodicals will not be issued.

7. No dues certificate from the library will be issued only after surrendering the library card.
8. Books should not be lent to anyone inside or outside the College.
9. Books will not be issued without library card. Only one book will be issued against a library card.
10. Students are expected to maintain silence in the library otherwise disciplinary action will be taken against misbehaviour.
11. Kindly replace the referred materials in the respective places after use.
12. Do not move tables and chairs from its place.
13. Books must be replaced if it is lost.
14. A fine of Rs.50/- will be collected per card if it is lost.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LIBRARY

1. Book Challenge

A short summary is to be submitted at the time of returning the books. EXAMINATIONS:

Each academic year comprises two semesters. Examinations are conducted at the end of each semester. MALPRACTICE
