**Objective of the program**

- To learn about the village perspective - Malandur village.
- To learn about the requirements and issues that the village community is facing.
- To know about the livelihood condition of the Malandur village.
- To identify the problems faced by people of Malandur village

**Date and Time:** 25-10-2023 / 10.30 a.m.

**No. Of Staff and Student participants:** 1 staff and 10 participants

**Theme of the program** is based on Innovation and Design Thinking

**Content:**

Malandur, situated in the Ellapuram Block within Tiruvallur District of Tamil Nadu, India, is a village located 24 kilometers to the north of the district's headquarters, Tiruvallur. Our arrival in Malandur village occurred at 11:15 a.m., and the students were subsequently divided into two groups to explore the village.

The village comprises approximately 550 households with a population ranging from 1800 to 2000 residents. During their interactions with the villagers, the participants learned the following:

- Most villagers primarily engage in agriculture and related activities.
- A few residents are involved in construction work, often requiring them to travel to other districts.
- Women participate in self-help group activities and also seek daily wage employment.

Following their interactions with the villagers and observations of the village, the participants identified several pressing issues that require attention:


- Due to its remote location, Malandur lacks adequate transportation facilities in the event of an emergency.
- The government bus service is irregular, with only one bus in the morning and one in the evening.
- Malandur's proximity to the redwood forest increases its vulnerability to various risks.
- The conditions of the two existing schools, the primary and higher secondary schools, are unsatisfactory, with ongoing renovation observed in the primary school during our visit.
- The village lacks proper medical facilities for emergencies, which is particularly concerning given its proximity to forested areas. In case of snakebites, residents must travel 15 kilometres to reach the hospital.
- Like many other Indian villages, Malandur exhibits a segregation of communities based on caste. Scheduled caste and tribe members reside in an area known as Cheri, which is isolated from the main village where backward community and general community members live. This separation has a disproportionate impact on the Scheduled caste and tribe residents, as developmental projects and schemes primarily benefit the main village, which is less accessible to them.
- Sanitation facilities in the village are inadequate, contributing to poor living conditions.
- As a result of the poor schooling system in the village, students aspiring to pursue higher education often feel demotivated.

#### Learning outcome of the programs

Exposure to the village has given us a lot of insights about the village lifestyle and we also came to know about the needs and wants

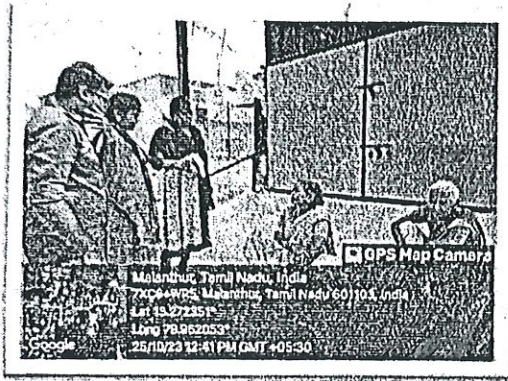
- Participants gained a deeper understanding of rural life and its challenges.
- Participants developed empathy and an appreciation for the cultural diversity and traditions of rural communities.

**Objective of the program**

- To have a fundamental comprehension of Meyyur Village.
- To become aware of the problems that the rural community faces.
- To take the lead and provide assistance in promoting sustainable agricultural and natural resource management.

**Date and Time:** 25-10-2023 / 10.30 a.m.

**No. Of Staff and Student participants:** 1 staff and 10 participants

**Theme of the program** is based on Innovation and Design Thinking

**Content:**

Meyyur is a village in the Thiruvallur District of Tamil Nadu State, India's Poondi Block. It is 13 KM north of the Tiruvallur district headquarters. Poondi is 7 kilometres away, thirty-five kilometres from Chennai, the state capital. When we arrived in Meyyur village at 11:30 a.m.,

the students were split up into two groups and given free reign to explore the hamlet.

The community has a population of between 2300 and 2800 people living in about 647 dwellings.

The following lessons were acquired by the participants via their encounters with the villagers:

**OCCUPATIONAL ACTIVITY**

- The majority of the villagers work in agriculture and similar fields; a small number of people are employed in construction, which frequently requires them to travel to different districts.
- Women look for daily pay work in addition to taking part in self-help group activities.

The participants discovered a number of urgent problems that need to be addressed after their conversations with the inhabitants and observations of the community. Meyyur lacks basic amenities like transportation, sanitary facilities, healthcare, and appropriate roads because of its distant position.

**INFRASTRUCTURE:**

The absence of emergency medical facilities in the village is worrisome because of its close proximity to wooded areas. Residents must travel about 10 miles to the hospital in the event of a snakebite. The circumstances in the current schools are inadequate; during our tour, we saw ongoing renovations in the elementary school. Students who wish to continue further education frequently feel demotivated due to the lack of educational institutions in the village. The village's insufficient sanitation facilities worsen the poor quality of life there.

**CASTE:**

Meyyur displays caste-based community segregation, just like many other Indian villages. Cheri, a remote location away from the main village where the backward community and general population dwell, is home to members of the scheduled caste and tribe. Because development initiatives and schemes generally benefit the main village, which is less accessible to them, the inhabitants of Scheduled caste and tribe are disproportionately affected by this separation.

**TRANSPORTATION:**

Without the proper road infrastructure, the village community faces challenges in getting to work and other activities during the wet season. The bus service is erratic, with only one or two buses running in the morning and evening.

**Learning outcome of the programs:**

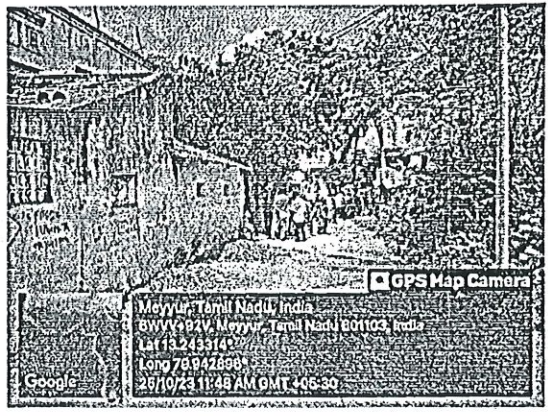
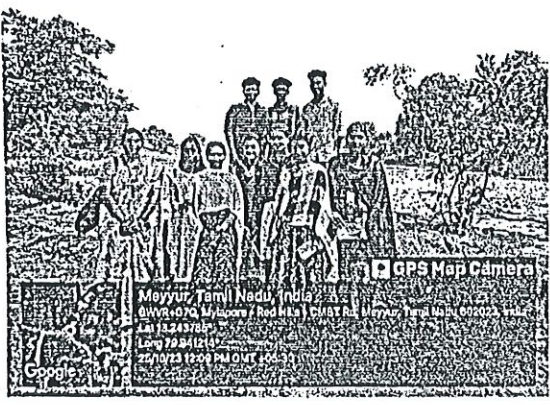
Our exposure to the village has provided us with a wealth of knowledge on the local way of life and the issues that the village community faces.

inauguration ceremony with the staffs and coordinators of Myrtle. After the inauguration trainee

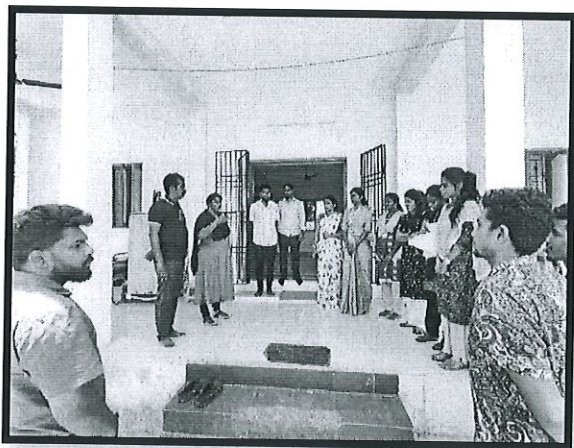

There was not a proper interaction with the community people and the trainees, they felt like unsecured. No proper residency for them ( patta), the whole community were based on daily labor and there was not proper education for the community children, if they want to go they need to travel Attrampakam only then they can study. In this Govinda Rajakuppam, child marriage is mandatory.

Finally we commute back to our place and the student in-charges of the food committee started the preparation for the dinner with the guidance of Ms.Jennifer. After dinner we had our evaluation. In evaluation we discussed about the programmed scheduled of the day, agenda, finance, food, travel, etc and also about the next days program scheduled agenda. Thus the day ended with a good amount of experience.
