

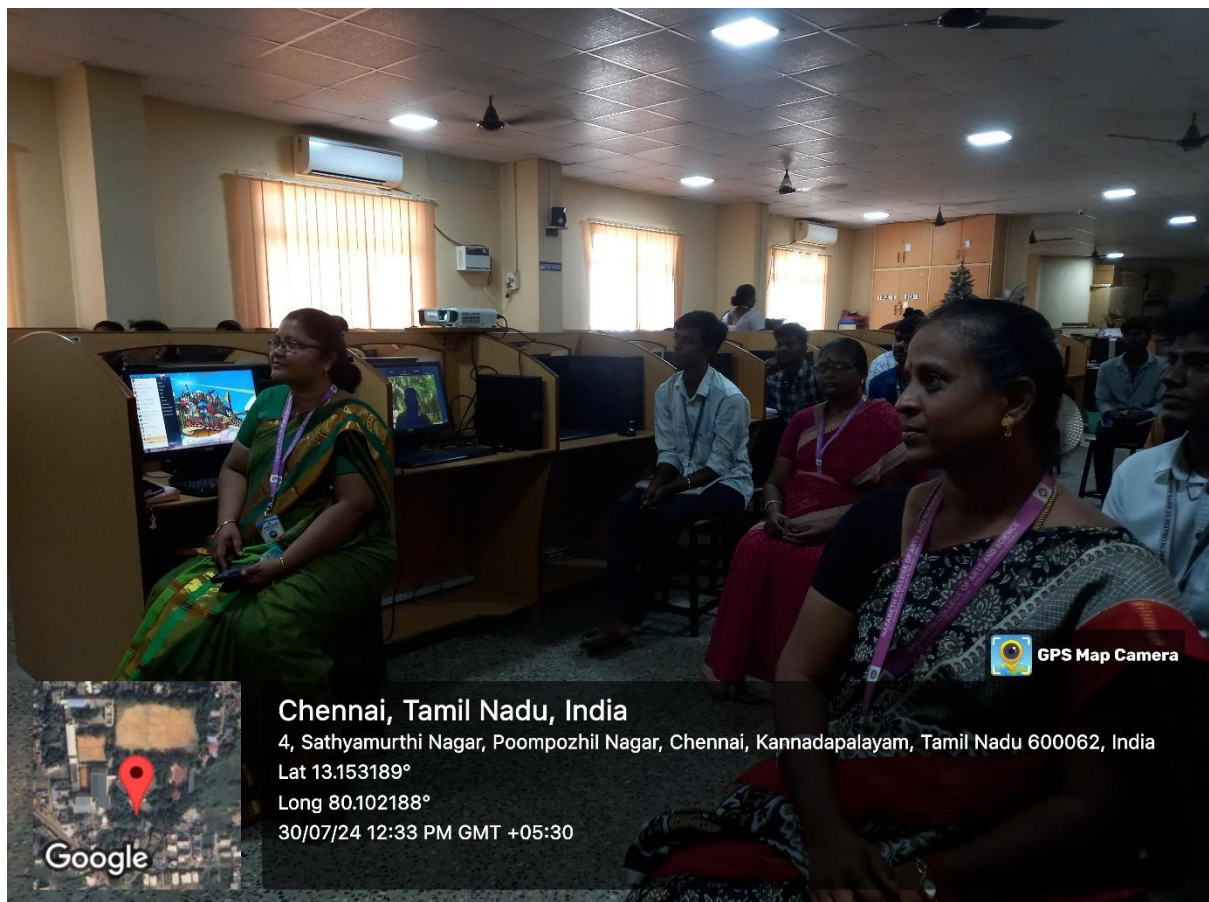
Introduction

Details of the Webcasts

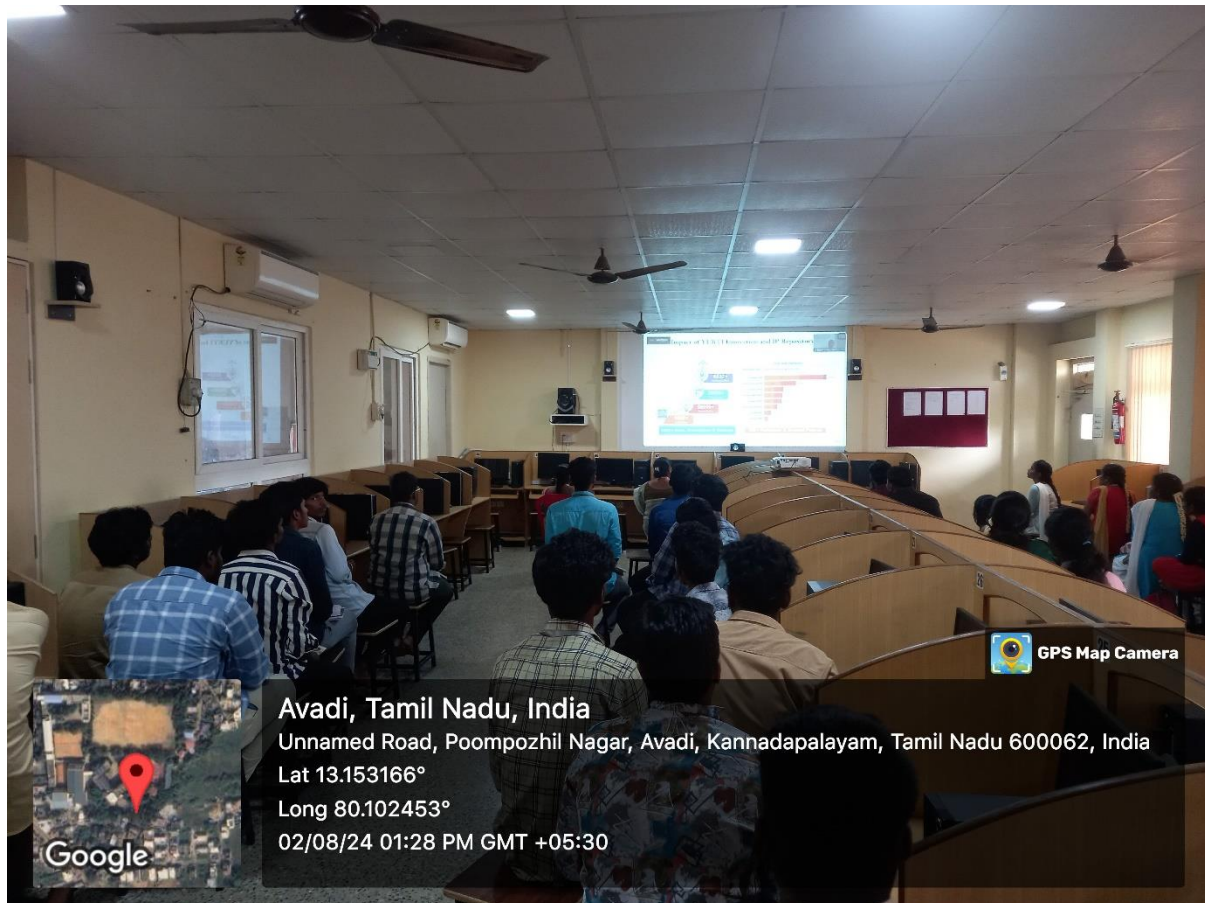
