





Following the session, faculty members enjoyed activities such as swimming and a parasail ride before lunch. Post-lunch, there was a fun-filled session of singing and dancing.



REPORT

Objective of the program

- > To have a fundamental comprehension of Meyyur Village.
- > To become aware of the problems that the rural community faces.
- > To take the lead and provide assistance in promoting sustainable agricultural and natural resource management.

Date and Time: 25-10-2023 / 10.30 a.m.

No. Of Staff and Student participants: 1 staff and 10 participants

Theme of the program is based on Innovation and Design Thinking

Content:

Meyyur is a village in the Thiruvallur District of Tamil Nadu State, India's Poondi Block. It is 13 KM north of the Tiruvallur district headquarters. Poondi is 7 kilometres away, thirty-five kilometres from Chennai, the state capital. When we arrived in Meyyur village at 11:30 a.m., the students were split up into two groups and given free reign to explore the hamlet.

The community has a population of between 2300 and 2800 people living in about 647 dwellings. The following lessons were acquired by the participants via their encounters with the villagers:

CHENNAI SO SO SO SO SO

OCCUPATIONAL ACTIVITY

- The majority of the villagers work in agriculture and similar fields; a small number of people are employed in construction, which frequently requires them to travel to different districts.
- Women look for daily pay work in addition to taking part in self-help group activities.

The participants discovered a number of urgent problems that need to be addressed after their conversations with the inhabitants and observations of the community. Meyyur lacks basic amenities like transportation, sanitary facilities, healthcare, and appropriate roads because of its distant position.

INFRASTRUCTURE:

The absence of emergency medical facilities in the village is worrisome because of its close proximity to wooded areas. Residents must travel about 10 miles to the hospital in the event of a snakebite. The circumstances in the current schools are inadequate; during our tour, we saw ongoing renovations in the elementary school. Students who wish to continue further education frequently feel demotivated due to the lack of educational institutions in the village. The village's insufficient sanitation facilities worsen the poor quality of life there.

CASTE:

Meyyur displays caste-based community segregation, just like many other Indian villages. Cheri, a remote location away from the main village where the backward community and general population dwell, is home to members of the scheduled caste and tribe. Because development initiatives and schemes generally benefit the main village, which is less accessible to them, the inhabitants of Scheduled caste and tribe are disproportionately affected by this separation.

TRANSPORTATION:

Without the proper road infrastructure, the village community faces challenges in getting to work and other activities during the wet season. The bus service is erratic, with only one or two buses running in the morning and evening.

Learning outcome of the programs:


Our exposure to the village has provided us with a wealth of knowledge on the local way of life and the issues that the village community faces.




Session on Angel Investors: Awareness about startup and support services 30/08/2023




From October to December each year, a very large area of South India, including Tamil Nadu, the coastal regions of Andhra Pradesh and the union territory of Puducherry, receives up to 30 percent of its annual rainfall from the northeast monsoon (or winter monsoon). Unlike during the regular monsoon, rainfall during the northeast monsoon is sporadic, but typically far exceeds the amount produced by the regular monsoon by up to 130 percent. This excessive rainfall can be exacerbated by an El Nino year, which 2015 is. In addition, unplanned and often illegal urban development has led to many wetlands and natural sinks being built over; this, along with ageing civic infrastructure and poorly designed drainage systems, has resulted in an increased frequency of heavy flooding. The flooding in these districts was described as the worst in a century and More than 300 people were killed and thousands displaced.

Chennai and neighbouring districts such as Thiruvallur and Kancheepuram were vastly affected by rains that broke all previous records in the months of November and December 2015. This further triggered a huge surge in all the rivers that run through these districts. Large areas were inundated by these floods. The puzhal reservoir is located here and the Arani, Kooum and other rivers run through this block.

Rationality/Justification of project:

Balasubramaniam Nagar is a small colony in Chinna Mathur village of the Manali block. The village is located along madhavaram ring road. The deluge has washed away all their belongings- Houses, utensils, grains and other things. People are taking shelter at high embankment to save their lives and they are facing problems of shelter, safe drinking water, medical care, food, and hygienic.

Most of the people who live in the village are schedule caste and religious minorities. Given their general poverty they depend heavily on the daily wage from nearby land owners as well as the MGNREGA programmes of the government. Both of these have been cut off during the recent rains. Immediate relief work by us will be extremely useful. The village has about 250 families. The total population of the village is about 700. We intend to supply relief items to all the 250 families. We have discussed our proposed relief work with the people in the village and they are very supportive of the effort and are desperately looking forward to the same.

1. Let there be Light Project

Solar streetlights are raised light sources which are powered by solar panels generally mounted on the lighting structure or integrated into the pole itself. The solar panels charge a rechargeable battery, which powers a LED lamp during the



night. Arikambattu one of the UBA adopted village has a hamlet of Irular Tribal families who shared their need for electricity from nearby houses. Based on the survey the UBA approached donors to provide light to the community. Habitat India Delhi with the help od donors provided 45 streetlamps and 45 batteries that can be used to for fan and 1 chargeable light to give them light.



TOTAL BENEFICIARIES REACHED: Awareness provided to 45 Irular families on Solar energy tapping and benefits and maintenance of the unit.

2. Potable Clean Water:

Clean water is one of the few things in life that never fails to live up to expectations. Clean water changes almost everything. Having clean water and sanitation means being able to avoid exposure to countless diseases. Every year, millions of people die from diseases caused by inadequate water supply,



sanitation, and hygiene. Based on the survey and the need of the community the UBA team approached World Vision India for water filters. World vision donated nonelectric water filters to the households in Meyyur village.



TOTAL BENEFICIARIES REACHED:

Awareness provided to 950 STUDENTS on Clean water 85 households.





3. Sustainable Sanitation- Connecting communities:



The few households in the village population of Meyyur lack access to proper sanitation. People must often use open air, unhygienic shared toilets. Based on the

survey and the need of the community the UBA team approached Habitat India for Bio Toilets for the community to



solve open defecation. Education has been an essential part of the effort too. Bank of America constructed bio toilets to households in Meyyur village.

TOTAL BENEFICIARIES REACHED: Awareness provided to 950 STUDENTS on Clean water 85 households.

4. Cyber Security Awareness Program:




Hindu college and Mar Gregorios College participated in various events. The Day 2 competitions were group dance, solo singing, mime, connection, quiz, and ramp walk.





10. DRUG AWARENESS


