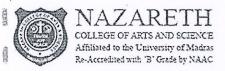

EXCHANGE AGREEMENT BETWEEN NAZARETH COLLEGE OF ARTS & SCIENCE AND HANDONG GLOBAL UNIVERSITY

Nazareth College of Arts & Science (affiliated to University of Madras) situated at Kovilpathagai Main Road, Avadi, Chennai 600062, India and Handong Global University, 558 Handong-ro Bukgu, Pohang Gyeongbuk, 37554, Republic of Korea agree to enter into the following agreement.

1 Definition

Home Institution shall refer to the institution where the student is registered as a full-time undergraduate student.

Host Institution shall refer to the institution that has agreed to accept the student from the home institution for a designated period.

Semester or Academic Year shall refer to the respective timeframes of the host institution unless specified otherwise.

Student Exchange Program shall refer to the program where students from the home institution attend the host institution for a designated period and receive accreditation for the coursework conducted therein.

Inbound Exchange Students shall refer to students participating in the student exchange program who are received by the home institution.

Outbound Exchange Students shall refer to students participating in the student exchange program who are sent to the host institution.

Confidential Information shall refer to commercial or sensitive information exchanged between the institutions identified by the disclosing party as confidential.

Intellectual Property shall refer to all copyright including future copyright, trademarks, designs, patents registered and unregistered, trade secrets, and all other intellectual property as defined in the convention of 1967 establishing the World Intellectual Property Organization.

2 Purpose of Agreement

2.1 The purpose of this agreement shall be to establish relations between the two participating institutions (hereinafter referred to as "both parties") in order to enhance educational and cultural opportunities for students and to achieve a mutually beneficial academic partnership.

3 Scope of Agreement

3.1 Subject to mutual consent, both parties shall cooperate in the following activities:

- 3.2 The terms of cooperation for each specific activity shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of that activity.
- 3.3 Any such agreements newly entered into shall form appendixes to this Agreement.

4 Term of Agreement

- 4.1 This Agreement shall come into effect on the date of signature by both parties and shall remain in force for 5 years unless it is terminated at an earlier time in accordance with clause 17.1.
- 4.2 In the event that both parties wish to renew this Agreement, and the renewal has not been finalized upon expiry of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall continue to apply from the time of written confirmation that both parties wish to renew until the institutions have signed a new agreement.

5 Responsibilities of Both Parties

- 5.1 Each institution shall designate a liaison officer to coordinate and develop the activities and programs agreed upon in clause 3.1.
- 5.2 Each institution shall inform the other party of any changes to the program dates, expenses, conditions, and any other reasonably relevant information in a timely and accurate manner.
- 5.3 Each institution shall cooperate in providing such information or assistance that may be reasonably requested by the other party to perform their obligations under this Agreement or to satisfy any legal, regulatory, or contractual requirements that are applicable.
- 5.4 The host institution shall in good faith provide inbound exchange students with all academic resources and support services available to regular students at the host institution as may be reasonably provided.
- 5.5 The host institution shall promptly and thoroughly investigate any complaint by inbound exchange students of unlawful discrimination or harassment at the host institution and take prompt and effective remedial action when unlawful discrimination or harassment is found to have occurred.
- 5.6 The host institution shall promptly notify the home institution of the existence and outcome of any complaint of unlawful discrimination or harassment by, against, or involving any exchange student, except in such circumstances where the victim requests nondisclosure.

- 5.7 The home institution shall be responsible for determining the eligibility of financial assistance for each of its outbound exchange students.
- Responsible officers of both parties shall conduct an annual review of the student exchange program to make appropriate and mutually agreed modifications as may be required.

6 Student Exchange Program

- 6.1 The host institution shall accept and enroll inbound exchange students as full-time, non-degree students.
- 6.2 Students participating in the student exchange program shall remain enrolled at the home institution and shall return to the home institution after the designated period of participation.
- 6.3 Subject to the availability of suitable candidates, each institution shall send to the other up to two (2) students each academic semester during the period of the agreement, unless agreed otherwise in advance.
- The period of study for the student exchange program shall be for one (1) semester. Students may extend their period of study upon receiving the approval of each institution and completing the procedure for the extension.

7 Eligibility and Selection

- 7.1 Each institution shall screen applications from its student body and propose candidates for participation in the student exchange program. The date by which the list of candidates and completed applications must be submitted shall be designated by the responsible officers.
- 7.2 Applicants shall be required to meet all admission standards of the host institution, including but not limited to grade level, academic merit, and English language proficiency.
- 7.3 The host institution shall provide applicants with information regarding admission standards and procedures and provide reasonable assistance for the applicants to comply with these requirements.
- 7.4 The host institution may reject any applicant who does not satisfy their admission standards or the procedural requirements during the application process.
- 7.5 In the case of rejection, the host institution shall provide written reasons for the rejection and the home institution may propose alternative candidates for consideration.

8 Responsibilities of Students

8.1 Students participating in the student exchange program shall be entitled to the same rights and privileges and subject to the same rules, procedures, and penalties as regular students enrolled in the host university.

EGE OF

- 8.2 Students participating in the student exchange program shall be responsible to meet all conditions required to obtain a student visa, and the host university shall provide reasonable assistance in the procurement thereof. The host institution shall not be liable for deferring, suspending, or canceling a student's enrollment due to non-compliance with visa requirements.
- 8.3 Students participating in the student exchange program shall be responsible for procuring a health insurance policy in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations.
- 8.4 Students participating in the student exchange program shall abide by the behavioral guidelines and standards of the host institution. The host university shall reserve the right to, at its discretion, dismiss students from the university for any serious violations, including but not limited to disruptive behavior or conduct that could bring the university into disrepute.

9 Accreditation

- 9.1 Enrollment status shall correspond to the standards of the home institution and shall be determined by the final number of credit hours in which the student is enrolled at the host institution. Students shall register for credit hours in accordance with the minimum and maximum hours designated by the host institution unless arranged otherwise.
- 9.2 It shall be the responsibility of each student to obtain official approval from their home institution regarding the accreditation of courses taken at the host institution.
- 9.3 The host institution shall reserve the right to exclude inbound exchange students from registering in specific units of study and may require pre-approval from the relevant faculty or department prior to allowing registration.
- 9.4 The host university shall provide the home institution with official academic transcripts in print or electronic form promptly after the final release of the results.

10 Program Expenses

- 10.1 The amount of tuition and other fees waived shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing prior to the nomination period for each academic semester.
- The host institution shall, in a timely manner, provide to the home university an invoice for each inbound exchange student detailing all university-related costs.
- 10.3 All other costs including travel, accommodation, and living expenses, as well as ancillary costs related to participation in the student exchange program shall be the responsibility of each student.

11 Accommodations

- 11.1 The host institution shall endeavor to provide inbound exchange students with accommodation on campus.
- If accommodation on campus cannot be provided, the host institution shall provide information on alternative forms of accommodation and provide reasonable assistance in the procurement thereof.
- Students who do not wish to reside in the accommodation provided by the host institution shall be responsible for organizing their own residence.
- The host university shall not have the obligation to provide accommodation or related assistance to individuals other than the inbound exchange student.

12 Faculty and Staff Exchange

Both parties agree in principle to the exchange of faculty and staff members, and the details of such arrangements shall be negotiated at the appropriate time.

13 Privacy and Confidential Information

- 13.1 The applicable privacy laws of the Republic of Korea and India shall apply to both parties in relation to any matter concerning privacy or the protection of personal information of exchange students, and any personal information provided by one institution to another.
- Both parties shall agree to not disclose any confidential information to third parties without prior written consent and may only use such confidential information for purposes of performing their obligations under this agreement.
- 13.3 All obligations related to privacy and confidential information shall continue beyond the termination of this Agreement and shall not extend to disclosures required by law.

14 Intellectual Property

- 14.1 Each institution shall retain ownership of the intellectual property in its promotional materials and shall grant to the other party a non-exclusive, non-transferable, revocable license to use the intellectual property in the promotional material it makes available for the purpose of performing their obligations under this Agreement.
- Each institution shall only use promotional material provided or endorsed by the other party and shall not modify any written material or documents provided without prior written consent.
- 14.3 Both parties shall agree not to use the logo, registered or unregistered trademark, design, or crest (hereinafter referred to as "Mark") of the other party without prior written consent to the particular use.

Both parties shall agree not to use any Mark of the other party in a way which, in the reasonable opinion of the other party, would damage or bring into disrepute the name, image, or reputation of the other institution.

15 Indemnity

- 15.1 Each institution shall indemnify, defend, and hold the other Party, its trustees, officers, employees, agents, representatives, and students against all liability, loss, costs, damages, or expenses (including legal expenses) arising as a result of any willful misconduct or negligent act or omission by the indemnifying institution.
- Neither institution shall be liable to the other party for incidental damages such as loss of profits, revenue, goodwill, or opportunities, and each institution's liability under this Agreement shall be reduced to the extent that any liability, loss, costs, damages, or expenses arise from or are attributable to any willful or negligent act or omission.

16 Nature of Agreement

- 16.1 This Agreement and any appendix to it shall constitute a binding Agreement for both parties and shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties on its subject matter.
- Neither party may assign, novate, waive, or alter its rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other.
- 16.3 Neither party shall be liable for any breach of its obligations under this Agreement to the extent that the breach results from an event beyond the institution's reasonable control.

17 Termination of Agreement

- 17.1 Either Institution may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving the other Institution six (6) months written notice of termination.
- 17.2 Termination of this Agreement shall not affect any student or persons who have already commenced any of the activities agreed upon in **clause 3.1** and the terms of this Agreement shall continue to apply in relation to these individuals.

18 Amendment of Agreement

18.1 This Agreement and any appendix to it shall be amended, modified, extended, or renewed only with the written, mutual consent of both parties.

19 Other Issues .

- Other issues that may arise in relation to the execution of this Agreement shall be resolved by the responsible officers through mutual agreement.
- Both parties must, without delay and in good faith, attempt to resolve any dispute, controversy, or claim arising out of or in relation to this Agreement.

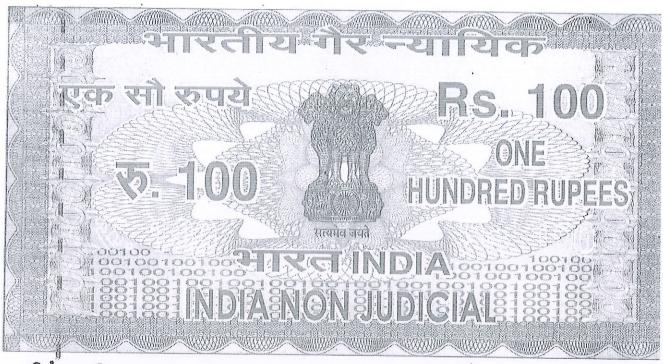

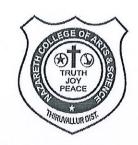
