DRESS CODE

Boys:

a) PHYSICAL EDUCATION

A student has to participate compulsorily in games and sports during the first year as a part of her course requirement. 40 hours of attendance is compulsory. Students will not be eligible for their degree if the credit for games is not earned. Provision will be made to meet attendance and other academic requirements when the student represents the College, the University, the State or the Country. An official letter duly signed by the organizing agency, Physical Director and Head of the Major Department along with a letter from the parents has to be submitted in the Principal's Office.

COLLEGE OFFICES

OFFICE OF THE PRINCIPAL

Students can meet the Principal during the short break or after class hours. The principal's office should be contacted to obtain leave, Travel Concession forms, Transfer and degree Certificates. The office of the principal is also open for counselling and grievance redressal.

EXAMINATION OFFICE

The Controller of Examinations holds administrative authority over all matters related to examinations. Students are required to read carefully and observe all the rules and regulations relating to examinations.

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE

The administrative office holds the responsibility of issuing no due forms, ID cards, collecting fees and other discharging duties assigned by Secretary, Principal and Vice Principal.

6.B.A. (English Literature)

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

The University of Madras has introduced Choice Based Credit System in Undergraduate/Post Graduate courses from the Academic year 2008 – 2009. According to this system, the students are given various course options in which he/she can choose from. These are offered as Non-major electives and credits are allotted at the end of the semester (Nov/April) after the conduct of the University examinations.
