
THE INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO ADANI PORT AT KATTUPALLI

- 5. To foster digital literacy among self-help group women, enabling them to use technology for personal, educational, and business purposes.
- 6. To promote teamwork and collaboration skills through group projects and real-world problem-solving activities in hardware and networking.

Session Highlights

Unit I – Basics of Computer and Hardware Components

- Conducted by Ms. Meenakshi, Head of Lab Administration
- Covered topics including Basics of Computers, Generations of Computers, Hardware and Software Components, and PC Installation.
- Participants learned about basic electrical and electronic components related to hardware and networking.
- The session concluded with a quiz, where participants answered over 50 questions confidently.

Unit II & IV – Windows Installation and Networking Concepts

- Conducted by Mr. Shanmugaraja, Lab Administrator.
- Covered Windows Installation, Network Components, Crimping, Punching, and Cabling Techniques.
- Provided hands-on PC installation training, including creating a system image.
- Participants gained practical knowledge in assembling and repairing desktop PCs, installing operating systems (Windows & Linux), updating drivers, setting firewall security, and data recovery techniques.

Unit III & V – Laptop Repairing and Troubleshooting

- Conducted by Mr. Vethamuthu Daniel, Lab Administrator.
- Covered Laptop Components, Installation, Disassembling, OS & Driver Installation, and Troubleshooting.
- Demonstrated different types of laptops and motherboards.

Session Details:

Yuvarani, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Computer Science Details: Discussions centered around AI-driven job opportunities, required skill sets, and strategies to prepare for AI-integrated workplaces. Insights on AI certifications and courses were provided. The session also covered AI tools for career guidance, including resume building, interview preparation, and PPT generation, helping faculty members understand how AI can assist in professional development.

Day 4 (January 10, 2025):

Day 5 (January 11, 2025):


Topic: The Role of Green AI - Ethics in Technology



E-Waste Drop-Off @ Nazareth College



2. Folk Arts, Crafts, and Design Aesthetics





A feedback session allowed participants to share insights, appreciating the event's organization and impact. A video montage captured key moments, concluding with a vote of thanks by Ms. Shamile.







The coordination of these efforts was overseen by Dr. Rani, and her team members from the mentoring cell. Overall, the session was conducted effectively and served its purpose well.

Day 3: Introduction to Creativity & Art and Culture Day-11/7/2024

The first session of the first-year induction program was initiated by Mr. Subramanian, Assistant Professor from the Department of Visual Communication. He delivered an engaging talk on the topic "Introduction to Creativity," focusing on Visual Effects (VFX). Mr. Subramanian explained that VFX refers to imagery created, manipulated, or enhanced for films or other moving media that is not captured during live-action shooting. This process often involves integrating actual footage with computer-generated imagery (CGI) to create realistic environments that are either too dangerous to film or simply do not exist in reality. He

highlighted the difference between visual effects and special effects, noting that VFX is computer-based and added post-production, whereas special effects, or SFX, are created on set, such as controlled explosions or fake gunshot wounds. Mr. Subramanian provided examples of VFX, including dragons in "Game of Thrones" and spaceships in "Star Wars."

He also discussed the various software used in VFX, such as Adobe After Effects, Blackmagic Design: Fusion, Apple Final Cut Pro Motion, HitFilm Pro, Filmora Pro, Blender, and Autodesk Maya. Additionally, he outlined career opportunities in the VFX industry, mentioning roles like multimedia specialist, advertising art director, music producer, production designer, film director, film/video editor, and TV production coordinator/producer. The session aimed to introduce students to the creative possibilities within the field of VFX and the diverse career paths available, sparking their interest and providing a foundational understanding of this dynamic and rapidly evolving industry.

The second session was conducted by Ms.Dhivya, Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, delivered an insightful talk on the values of culture and arts. A video presentation highlighting the intrinsic values of celebrating arts and culture was also shown, enriching the students' understanding and appreciation of cultural heritage.

The third and fouth session was a vibrant cultural program as part of the induction program where students showcased their diverse talents through various cultural performances. This event saw enthusiastic participation from first year students across various disciplines. Additionally, a series of competitions such as nail art, mehndi, newspaper craft, pot painting, essay writing, poetry writing, drawing, bridal makeup, and quiz were conducted. These competitions aimed to ignite students' interest in arts and culture, providing them with a

Approximately 300 first-year students attended these sessions, actively participating in discussions and activities that enhanced their understanding and commitment to tackling these important social issues. - 3. To enhance students' and faculty members' research capabilities and critical thinking skills.






REPORT ON IMPACT OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE ON YOUTH
